MANDATORY CREATION OF IDs OF ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDITS/ AUTOMATED PERMANENT ACADEMIC ACCOUNT REGISTRY (ABC/APAAR ID)

- Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) is a virtual/digital storehouse that contains the information for all the credits earned by individual students throughout their learning journey. It will enable students to open their accounts and give multiple options for entering and leaving Colleges or Universities.
- The APAAR/ABC ID acts as a link to download the Grade Card and Degree from the DigiLocker, an online repository where students can securely store essential documents. It is linked to the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) via the APAAR/ABC ID, and will receive academic credits from institutions through applications, simplifying the verification of academic records etc.
- Every student is required to register for APAAR/ABC ID - a unique 12-digit code to store, manage and access all their academic credits, including degrees, diplomas, certificates training details and co-curricular accomplishments etc.
- The steps for registering themselves on DigiLocker are provided below. Therefore, students are requested to create the ABC ID themselves with the DigiLocker for their future reference. While filling the admission form.

STEPS TO CREATE AN ABC/APAAR ID THROUGH DIGI LOCKER:

Bhiwani has been a prominent centre of commerce since the time of the Mughals. Bhiwani is also known for its temples and is known as the "Small Kashi" of India because of them. Gauri Shankar temple (Kirorimal temple) of Bhiwani is known countrywide. The district is famous for its mineral resources. Different types of mineral resources such as kankar, saltpeter road metal are available in the district. There are about 110 quarries of kankar and building stone in the district. There are about 270 stone crushing units mostly situated in Kalyana and Tosham. These stone-crushing units cater to the building material requirements of the surrounding regions.

LIBRARY

The University maintains a well-stocked library having rich collection of more than 22612 books covering a wide range of disciplines, 42 Print journals and 07 are in process for purchase, 7129 E-journals, 10 magazines and 16 newspapers to support quality teaching and research. The library is fully automated using KOHA –Open Source Integrated Library System. The library has access to E-resources through NDL, ProQuest database and the resources available in Public Domain. Plagiarism Check service is offered through Urkund and Turnitin Softwares, free of cost to the researchers, students and faculty members of the University.



SPORTS AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Bhiwani is a well-known city of Haryana most often termed as mini Cuba in the field of Sports. Bhiwani is a power hub of sports of Haryana as well as India. More than 100 centres for nurturing the youth are being run around the city. The students of University teaching departments and affiliated colleges also participate in different All India Inter-university (AIU) Championships as well as National and International competitions. During the session 2019-20 the University organized an AIU Women Wrestling Championship in a successful way. Chaudhary Bansi Lal University is achieving heights of glory in the field of sports. Four students were selected in World University Games to be held in China in 2021. Twenty-Three sportspersons representing CBLU Bhiwani took part in the first Khelo India national games held at Ranchi, Bhubaneshwar and obtained 18th position out of 159 Universities winning 4 gold and 2 bronze medals. The University has adequate sports facilities.

YOUTH WELFARE DEPARTMENT

Ch. Bansi Lal University Bhiwani has a very vibrant and efficient Department of Youth Welfare. With the special attention and efforts made by the Vice-Chancellor, the Department of Youth Welfare became fully functional from the academic session 2018-19 under the dynamic leadership Dean, Students Welfare. The Department of Youth Welfare is fully committed and leaving no stone unturned for the holistic development of the students. The University in a short span of time has developed a strong base in disciplines of science such as Biotechnology, Zoology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Pharmaceutical Sciences etc. These Departments are well equipped with high-end instruments such as, Gradient PCR, Gel Doc System, NMR, MilliQ System, Speed Vac, UV-Visible Spectrophotometer, Autoclaves, BOD Incubators, Plant Growth Chamber, Microscopes, Centrifuges, SDS and Agarose Gel Electrophoresis etc. Steps have been taken to further upgrade the laboratories by Acquiring Florescent Microscopes, Dissecting Microscopes, Real-Time PCR FACS, Nano drop



and many more sophisticated instruments.

AUDITORIUM AND GUEST HOUSE

The University has its own state-of-the-art mini auditoriums in all the teaching blocks where the important events and activities are organized regularly. University maintains a guest-house having good facilities and comfortable stay for the guest and visitors. Dattopant Thengadi Centre for Development Studies

Rashtra Rishi Dattopant Bapurao Thengadi(10 November 1920 – 14 October 2004) born in a village Arvi of Wardha district of Maharashtra is known for his unique qualities of institution building, leadership & organizing skills and propounding the **Third Way** of socio-economic development based on the ideology of *Sanatan Dharma*. He was greatly influenced by the philosophy of *Ekatam Manavvad* propounded by Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya. According to him, neither right nor left is the solution to the ills of the world –degradation of the environment, concentration of income & wealth, unemployment and poverty, exploitation of labour, dominance of the western culture and values guided by individualism and self-interest. The real solution comes only from Indian culture based on the *dharma* and is the only solution to the problems. Sh. Thengadi Ji was ardent supporter of using labour intensive technologies, decentralization of decision making and use of country made products. He was against western motivated globalization.

He founded and nurtured some of the well-known and today's leading organizations such as **Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh**(1955), **Bharatiya Kisan Sangh**(1979) and **Swadeshi Jagran Manch**(1991). He authored many books of which most referred are: **The Third Way; Modernization Without Westernization; What Sustains Sangh? Our National Renaissance, It's Directions and Destination; Nationalist Pursuit; The Great Sentinel and The Perspective**. He was a great scholar, philosopher, visionary and orator yet modest, deeply rooted in the past and completely in tune with the modern time and sensitive to the issues of national importance. His ideas and philosophy is much more relevant than ever and thus needs more research and fair implementation.

Rational for the Establishment of Centre

Today world community in general and India in particular are facing several socio-economic crises in many areas. The prominent problems include growing problem of un-employment, rising threat to environment, concentration of wealth into few hands and threat to Indian value system including to the family system. Thengadi Ji's contribution and views on social, economic and political issues, provides an alternative to the philosophies of socialism and capitalism both of which have already failed in the world. It is in this context Chaudhary Bansi Lal University, Bhiwani decided to setup "**Dattopant Thengadi Centre for Development Studies**" in the faculty of Management and Commerce.

Objectives

The centre shall endeavor to achieve the following objectives:

- To initiate research on issues and ideas brought to public debate by Thengadi Ji.
- To bring his ideas and philosophy into public domain by networking with academic institutions through seminars, workshops and conferences.

Pharmacy, the science and art concerned with the preparation and standardization of drugs. Its scope includes the cultivation of plants that are used as drugs, the synthesis of chemical compounds of medicinal value, and the analysis of medicinal agents. Bachelor of Pharmacy is a four-year undergraduate programme typically covers subjects such as Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Pharmacology, Pharmacognosy, Pharmaceutics, and Pharmaceutical Analysis. This course contributes to the retention of highly qualified workers in the healthcare industry. Graduates of the Pharmacy course are equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to work in various sectors of the Pharmaceutical Industry, such as Research and Development, Manufacturing, Quality Control, Regulatory affairs, Clinical Pharmacy, and Community Pharmacy.

The admissions to B. Pharmacy programme will be made through the instructions of the Haryana State Technical Education Society (HSTES). In Industrial Pharmacy is a specialty area of Pharmaceutical Sciences that deals with the development, manufacturing, distribution, and quality control of medicines on a large scale, in simple words, it can also be described as conversion of raw materials into certain dosage forms. The two- year PG programme in Industrial Pharmacy and the course material is structured in such a way as to familiarize the students with the production of various pharmaceutical dosage forms, material management and analytical techniques required to evaluate dosage form. Students learn about industrial operations, instrumentation, developing technologies and diverse research approaches.

The PG programme in Drug Regulatory Affairs deals with the study of the importance of regulatory affairs, regulatory requirements for product approval, and documentation in pharmaceutical industry, with a special mention of the master formula record, drug master file, and distribution records. The regulatory affairs (RA) department of a pharmaceutical company is responsible for obtaining approval for new pharmaceutical products and ensuring that approval is maintained for as long as the company wants to keep the product on the market. A Regulatory personnel works as a unique synergy among internal departments of an industry with the regulatory bodies, which starts with the conceptualization of the product to be developed by that industry, till the marketing of that product. A regulatory affair personnel works a unique synergy of internal departments of an industry with the regulatory bodies, which starts with the conceptualization of the product to be developed by that industry, till the marketing of that product.

Two-year PG program in Pharmacology which deals with the interaction of drugs with living animals, the mechanisms of drug action as well as the therapeutic uses of the medicines. Pharmacology is often described as a bridge science because it incorporates knowledge and skills from a number of basic science disciplines including physiology, biochemistry, cellular and molecular biology. Pharmacologists are able to ‘translate’ such knowledge into the rational development of therapeutics and find the better way for the management of any disease. An exit scheme for students of M.Sc. Computer Science has been implemented w.e.f. 2020-2021 in

which a student of M.Sc. Computer Science (2-Year) of the UTDs and Affiliated Colleges of the University may exit the programme after completion of first year in all respect and after that, he/she may be granted One-year diploma certificate, i.e., PGDCA.

A promotion scheme of students of PGDCA has been implemented w.e.f. 2020-2021, in which a student of PGDCA of UTDs and Affiliated colleges of the University can pursue 2-Year M.Sc. Computer Science programme after completing PGDCA course if he/she desires and after that he/she may be promoted directly to 2nd Year of M.Sc. Computer Science. After completion of the programme, M.Sc. Computer Science (2-Year) degree may be granted to the student.

Further, the Department is offering one more cutting-edge programs: **Diploma in Cyber Security and Digital Forensic**. The Department offers a two-year postgraduate programme (Master of Science) in Geography (**M. Sc. Geography**). The programme places strong emphasis on experiential and interdisciplinary learning through practical sessions, fieldwork, and project-based assignments. Implemented under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) since the academic session 2019–20, and aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 through the Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LoCF) from 2025-26 onwards, the curriculum offers specializations in Geomorphology, Social Geography, Remote Sensing & GIS, Environmental Geography, and Regional Development.

In addition to rigorous academic training, the programme fosters competencies in research methodology, scientific inquiry, and IT applications in spatial sciences. Students gain valuable exposure by visiting sites of active geomorphic processes through physical field surveys, and by engaging meaningfully with society through socio-economic field studies, often facilitated through the department’s community outreach initiatives. The department regularly organizes a broad spectrum of academic and student-enrichment activities, including seminars, extension lectures, invited talks by eminent scholars, hands-on training sessions, and project presentations. These engagements not only promote holistic development but also enable students to interact with researchers from Institutes of National Importance and international academic institutions, thereby fostering a spirit of global academic engagement.

With a firm commitment to societal relevance and regional inclusivity, the department strives to provide high-quality education to students from the university’s command area. Special attention is given to empowering rural and agrarian communities, while preparing students for advanced research, competitive examinations, teaching careers, and employment in both government and industry sectors.

The department initially launched a **Postgraduate Diploma in Geo-informatics (PGDGI)** in the academic session 2020–21 with an intake capacity of 20 students. Following the successful completion of three consecutive batches, an excellent placement record, and increasing demand from both students and the geospatial industry, the programme has been elevated to a full-fledged Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Geo-informatics with an approved intake of 40 students. This upgraded programme is developed under the Learning Outcomes-based Curriculum Framework (LoCF), in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

The industry-integrated postgraduate course combines advanced academic training with practical industrial exposure, aiming to produce highly skilled professionals capable of meeting current and future challenges in the geospatial sector. The curriculum offers rigorous hands-on training in Remote Sensing, Geographic Information Systems (GIS), Global Navigation Satellite Systems (GNSS), digital image processing,

photogrammetry, and web-based geospatial applications, ensuring strong alignment with industry requirements.

CRITERIA AND WEIGHTAGES FOR PREPARING MERIT LIST

1.	While preparing the merit list, marks in fractions will not be rounded off.	
2.	The merit list will be prepared on adding the following weightages (as admissible) to the percentage of marks in the qualifying examination. Further in case of programmes where the eligibility condition is 10+2 or equivalent, the merit list shall be prepared using 75% of the marks obtained in 12 th , 25% of the marks obtained in 10 th , plus any admissible weightage(s). No documents on the basis of which weightage is claimed shall be entertained, if it has been issued after the last date of submission of online application:	
I.	Weightage for NCC -‘C’ certificate	5 marks
II.	Weightage for NSS merit certificate awarded by the University/ State Govt. (Annexure XIII-C)	5 Marks
III.	Weightage for having passed Hons. Programme in the subject and seeking admission to concerned P.G. course (Except BCA, BBA, BMLS & other undergraduate courses)	5Marks

Note: Total weightage will not exceed by 5 marks in any case wherever it is not mentioned.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The following procedure shall be followed for **selection of the candidates for admission** to various Programmes:

1. Before filling the Admission Application Form, the candidates are required to read the Prospectus/guidelines/instructions available on the University website carefully. Candidates will submit their Application Forms online on the University website: www.cblu.ac.in for admission to various Programmes/Courses.
2. The minimum eligibility and number of seats for admission to various courses will remain same as per information Brochure. Kindly visit University Website for more details and changes, if any.
3. In case, the seat(s) of various reserved categories remain vacant and no eligible candidate of the reserved categories is available in open counselling then the vacant seats may be converted into HOGC after the approval of the Vice-Chancellor.
4. Mere possession of the prescribed academic qualifications does not entitle a candidate for admission to the programme. Candidates would be required to fulfil all the conditions as spelt out in the Prospectus.
5. The eligibility of the candidates shall be ascertained at the time of preparing merit list. However, the admission seekers are required to ensure that they possess the prescribed qualification for the programme they are seeking admission in.
6. Merit list of all the eligible candidates shall be prepared as per criteria given in the Prospectus and shall be available on the website of the University and Notice Board of Department.
7. a) If two or more candidates secure identical merit, then the candidate senior in age will be given preference. In case, the date of birth is same then the marks of qualifying exam will be taken into account. If result of qualifying exam is also identical then the marks obtained in next lower class will be considered. However, in case of BC category, income criteria will be considered when the merit is same.
b) If two or more candidates secure identical merit in BC category, the children of persons having gross annual income of up to 3 lacs shall get preference for the benefit of reservations in the respective category.
8. The merit list for admission to the Programmes will be prepared by the Departments/Institutes of the Universities as per "Schedule" given in the Prospectus and will be uploaded on the website. No separate communication shall be sent in this regard.
9. The candidate whose name appears in the admitted candidates (in Merit list) shall have to deposit the fee within stipulated time or else his/her seat will be considered vacant.
10. Seats remaining vacant in one round of counselling will be filled up in the subsequent round of counsellings.
11. Counselling will be closed as soon as all the seats in each category are filled.
12. Candidate must be physically present for the counselling. In case of Medical Emergency, a medical certificate to that effect be submitted from the registered medical practitioner.
13. If the concerned authorities are not satisfied with the character/past behavior/antecedents of a candidate, they may refuse to admit him/her to any course of study in the University/College in order to ensure academic standards, discipline and peaceful atmosphere in the University. The Vice-Chancellor may cancel the admission of any student for a specified period on specific grounds.
14. A student having completed the Postgraduation in one subject is not eligible to seek admission in another regular Postgraduate course and Undergraduate except in case of professional course like MBA, MPES etc.
15. In case any candidate is found to have supplied false information, certificates, documents etc. or is found to have withheld or concealed some information in his/her Application Form, he/she shall be liable to be debarred from admission to the course and legal action may be taken against the candidate.
 - a. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage, his/her admission will be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/Institute may also take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate and his/her guardian.
 - b. Details of participation in the counselling and procedure of seat allotment will be made available soon on the website of CBLU, Bhiwani (www.cblu.ac.in)
 - c. For other details such as regarding enrolment of students, submission of registration/continuation Return, student's conduct and disciplinary rules, prohibition of ragging etc., the website of the University may be visited.
16. For any kind of dispute due to non-availability of rules/regulations of interpretation of rules/ regulations adopted during physical counselling the decision of Vice Chancellor will be final.

Note:

The continuation of a course shall be subject to maintaining a minimum of 50% admission intake and a comprehensive review every three years based on its performance, viability, relevance and admissions during the last three academic sessions.

**Additional/Supernumerary Seats
(To be filled up by Physical Counselling only)
UGC approved courses in UTDs**

In addition to the sanctioned seats, there will be additional seats for the following categories. The candidates seeking admission against these categories will have to apply online and after that their admission will be made by Physical Counselling only as per the rules of the University:

1. One supernumerary seat for Outstanding Sports Persons.
2. One supernumerary seat for Single Girl Child.
3. One supernumerary seat for participating in Cultural Activities.
4. Two supernumerary seats for Kashmiri Migrants.
5. 10% seats for NRI Candidates.
6. 15% seats for Foreign Candidates.
7. Two supernumerary seats for Residents of Prem Nagar village
8. 2% of the state quota (1.7% of total intake) will be given as supernumerary seats over & above the intake be given to the PwBD candidates in addition to the PH category.
9. One supernumerary Seat for student of third gender.

Since these seats are additional/supernumerary, they will not be converted at all in any other category in case they remain unfilled.

Note: -

1. **The reservation of seats is as per Reservation Policy of State Government of Haryana and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Government of Haryana/University from time to time.**
2. **The Chairperson of the concerned Departments shall ensure that the admissions are made according to reservation policy.**

ADMISSION AGAINST ADDITIONAL/ SUPERNUMERARY SEATS

Additional/Supernumerary seats will be filled up as per norms, guidelines and eligibility prescribed by CBLU, Bhiwani.

1. FOR SPORTS PERSONS

There will be one additional seat for Outstanding Sports Person in all programmes over and above the sanctioned seats. Such candidates will have to submit a Grading Certificate issued by the Director, Directorate of Sports and Youth Welfare, Government of Haryana.

The following will be the Criteria for admission to these seats, provided the candidate is otherwise eligible:

- I. 1st preference will be given to Sports Persons who have got positions (I /II /III) in an International Championship/ World cup/Olympics/Common Wealth Games/Asian Games.
- II. Candidate who represented India in the Tournaments mentioned in clause -I.
- III. Candidate who have won any positions (I/II/III) in All Indian Inter-University/Senior National Championship during Graduation.

Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

2. FOR SINGLE GIRL CHILD

One seat in each programme will be reserved for single girl child. The admission against this seat will be made on the basis of merit. The students seeking admission under this category will be required to submit the following documents:

- I. An affidavit for only (single) girl child on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs. 50/- duly attested by first class magistrate.
- II. Copy of Ration Card along with the page where student's name is mentioned (self- attested) Hindi or English version of the same, if the ration card is in any regional language. (In case of non-availability of Ration Card enclose a certificate from a local reputed person who knows your family very well).

3. FOR STUDENTS EXCELLING IN CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

One supernumerary seat in each programme in the University Teaching Department is earmarked to promote cultural activities subject to the fulfilment of the following conditions:

- I. Any position in the National Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities or the first position holder in the North Zone Inter University Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities.
- II. Events organized by Private Organizations/Associations will not be recognized for the purpose of admission.

4. FOR KASHMIRI MIGRANTS

Two additional seats in each course offered in the University is earmarked for Kashmiri Migrants. For the wards of Kashmiri migrants there will be:

- I. Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10%, subject to minimum eligibility conditions.
- II. 5% increase in the intake capacity in each programme offered.
- III. No domicile certificate is required.

The University earmarked the seats reserved for the Jammu & Kashmir Migrants in a specific programme of study at the time of counseling as per current practice. If any guideline is received from the Government before the commencement of counseling for the academic session 2026-27, the same shall be applied.

5. FOR NRI CANDIDATES

10% seats over and above the existing sanctioned intake are meant for actual NRI candidates and their children or wards in all programmes.

6. FOR FOREIGN CANDIDATES

15% additional supernumerary seats for foreign candidates out of which 5% seats have been earmarked for the children of Indian workers in the Gulf Countries and South Asia. These seats will not be filled, if such foreign candidates are not available.

7. For Residents of Prem Nagar Village

As per the 26th Meeting of EC held on 04-11-2020, Res. No. 20 and 5th Meeting of AC held on 22-04-2021, Agenda no. 03, the provision for one seat has been made in some programmes but later on provision for one extra seat i.e. in total 2 seats has been made in all the University Teaching Departments which are not governed by any regulatory bodies like AICTE, NCTE, PCI etc. This provision has been made over and above the existing intake as a supernumerary seat. Such students need to be eligible as per the eligibility requirement of concerned programme and the admission be made on the basis of merit from amongst those who applied against these seats. The seat is offered in the all the University Teaching Departments.

8. Supernumerary quota/seats belonging to category of PwBD Candidates

In compliance to the order of DGHE, Haryana, Panchkula conveyed vide Memo No. 35/1-2024-UNP (3) dated 06.3.2024. 2% of the state quota (1.7% of total intake) will be given as supernumerary seats over & above the intake be given to the PwBD candidates in addition to the PH category.

NOTE: A student having completed the Post-Graduation in one subject is not eligible to seek admission in another regular Postgraduate course and Undergraduate except in case of professional course like MBA, MPES etc.

REPORTING OF THE SELECTED CANDIDATE IN THE DEPARTMENT

The candidates who are admitted shall have to remain in contact with their respective department for information related to submission of all original documents (i.e. in support of Academic Qualifications, Character Certificate, category certificate, income certificate etc.) as per his/her claim for admission, time-table, classes and for any other information.

The candidates are advised to submit two sets of photocopies of all relevant documents as mentioned above with two passport size photographs to the concerned department as per the date and time suggested by the Chairperson/HOD/In charge.

CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING

1. Ragging in educational institutions is banned and anyone found guilty of ragging and /or abetting ragging whether actively or passively, or being a part of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009 as well as under the panel law for the time being in force.
2. The following will be termed as the act of ragging: any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by any act, which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student(s), indulging in rowdy or in-disciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in fresher or junior student(s) or asking the student(s) to do any act or perform something, which such student(s) will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.
3. Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other university functionaries like Proctor, Dean Students Welfare or Security Officer for help and guidance.
4. University will upload the instructions against ragging on its website along with Anti Ragging Helping Toll Free Number and will also make an Anti-Ragging Committee as per UGC Regulations.
5. Candidate is required to submit the undertaking to ensure that they shall not be indulge in ragging (above type of activities)- (Annexure XIX, XX).

RESERVATION OF SEATS IN VARIOUS PROGRAMMES

The seat matrix has been prepared on the basis of the reservation policy notified by the Govt. of Haryana vide Notification No. 22/10/2013 - IGSIII dated 28/2/2013, and instructions received from the State Govt. from time to time on the following basis:

In the event of quota reserved for Physically Handicapped remain unutilized due to non-availability for suitable category of Handicapped Candidates, it may be offered to the Ex-Servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% reservation is also provided to Ex-serviceman/ Freedom Fighter and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of General Category, 1% out of Scheduled Caste and 1% from Backward Classes category for admission to the various educational institutions of the Govt. and Govt. aided / Institutes located in Haryana. As far as Block allocation in Block-A and Block-B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block-A of Backward Classes are given seats in academic year 2018, the next Block i.e. (B) Block of Category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year 2019 and so on. Further, a roster register for reservation of seats for Ex-Servicemen/Freedom Fighter shall be maintained and carried forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided.

*** Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled castes for admission in any Govt. Educational Institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived scheduled castes as enumerated in Annexure-X, for more detail please refer to Annexure X**

GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

1. The reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of Haryana Govt. and is subject to change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-III. The list of Scheduled Castes notified by the Haryana Government is available at Annexure-VIII.
3. Candidates belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-IV (1 &2). The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government, is available at Annexure-IX. Circular no. 1170-SW (1)-95 dated 07.06.95 of the Haryana Govt. for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to at Annexure-XI.
4. The children or Grand Children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-V.
5. Only those candidates who have permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Physically Handicapped. They will submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Annexure-VI. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the University. The decision of Medical Board in this regard shall be final.
6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded Out from the Services or Ex-Servicemen and their wards) will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per Annexure-VI-A. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 08-01-2008:
 - i) Pension holders for continuous embodied service;
 - ii) Persons with disability attributable to military service;
 - iii) Gallantry Award Winners; and
 - iv) Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical/disability pension.
7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both reserved and general categories will be considered first in general category subject to the preference given for University/programme. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category. The Scheduled Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected/admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for scheduled caste/ backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfil condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No.13864-75 dated 24.08.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).
8. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.
9. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of BC (A) and BC (B), the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other category. For example, if any seat in BC (B) category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from BC (A) category and vice-versa.
10. As per the reservation policy of DGHE (Annexure XIII-A) 10% reservation is to be given in both State Quota seats under State Policy and all India Quota seats under Central Government Policy separately.

GUIDELINES RELATING TO FEE STRUCTURE

1. Programmes fee including examination fee is available in the Admission Brochure.
2. Selected candidates are required to deposit their dues online at University website.
3. Tuition fee and other dues will be payable for annually. Half tuition fee will be charged from girl students.
4. A student migrating from another University will be required to pay all the dues other than Tuition Fee and Amalgamated Fund, which will be charged with effect from the month following the one up to which these have been paid to the previous institution.
5. Dues must be paid on the dates notified; otherwise a late fee fine of Rs. 5/- (per day) up to 10 days from the dates notified and thereafter Rs. 10/- (per day) till the end of the month shall be charged. The name of the defaulter may be struck off the rolls, if the dues are not paid till the end of the month, unless permission is obtained from the Head of the Department concerned to make payment at later date within the next month. Students may be re- admitted with the permission of the Dean/Head of Department concerned on payment of Rs. 500/- along with the arrears of fee and/or fines provided that the Head of the Department is satisfied, that if re-admitted, the student will not fall short of the requisite percentage of attendance.
6. If the admission of a student is cancelled by the University for no fault of his/her, the fees and other dues paid by him/her will be refunded except the Admission Fee, provided the application to this effect duly recommended by the Dean/Head of the Department concerned is received in the University Office within one month of the date of the letter conveying the cancellation of admission. The application for the refund of dues submitted beyond the time limit prescribed above may be considered with permission of the Vice-Chancellor on merit.
7. The University employees/their wards/spouses including the wards of retired employees and wards of employees who die in harness shall be entitled to the following concessions:
 - Full Tuition fee concession.
 - Three fourth ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the Development Fee.

The University employees and their dependent wards will be given 50% concession on the total fee in the Self- Financing Courses. The employees or their wards shall, however, pay other normal dues.

8. If a student chooses to withdraw from the Programme of study in which he/she is enrolled, the institution concerned shall follow the following five-tier system as per **fee refund Policy issued by UGC vide DO No. F.2-71/2022(CPP-II) (C-114546) dated 12/06/2024 and duly adopted by the HSHEC vide letter no. 12/5-2020 P-X Adv. /HSHEC dated 21.06.2024**

9. Fees shall be refunded by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.
10. If HSTES, Panchkula issues any guidelines regarding refund policy for session 2026-27 for B. Pharmacy/ B. Pharmacy(Lateral Entry) Programmes, the same will be applicable for the refund cases of the session 2026-27 for the course.
11. The payment will be made through RTGS/NEFT in the Bank account of the concern student. Full details of bank account along with self-attested photocopy of the same be obtained from the candidates

12. Late fee paid by a student shall not be refunded under any circumstances.
13. Fee concession to students who are Below Poverty Line and are Yellow Card holders will be governed by the following Guidelines:
 - Students including brothers and sisters belonging to this category will be allowed full tuition fee concession subject to the production of proof.
 - They will be allowed 50% concession in room rent, if they seek admission to the University hostels.
 - Only those students of this category will be allowed this concession in subsequent years who clear all the papers of the previous examination in the first attempt.
14. **At the time of admission, fee may not be charged from the SC students whose parent's annual income is not more than 2.5 lacs. However, such candidates are required to apply online for Post-Matric Scholarship available on the website of Social Welfare Department, Govt. of Haryana. In case, anyone who fails to do so, he/she will have to pay full fee with the University Cashier. An undertaking to this effect must be submitted on the format available at Annexure XVIII. The claim on account of such fee may be submitted to the Higher Education Commissioner, Haryana, Panchkula after getting the same vetted from the Auditors of the Directorate for reimbursement.**
15. **For newly offered programmes in the session 2026-27, the fee may be increased during the programme for the financial sustainability of the programme.**

3. Stipends for dependent of freedom-fighters.
4. POSE scholarship scheme for students pursuing UG and PG courses in Science.
5. Scholarship for single girl child.
6. **Special financial assistance to Meritorious students scoring at least 80% of the marks in the qualifying examination. Applications will be invited in the month of August.**

Migration:

The students taking admission in this University having their qualifying exam from any other University/ Board needs to submit the migration certificate up to the last date as decided by the concerned Branch/ Department, after that late fee will be charged as per University norms or any action can be taken by the authority.

Other Activities:

The **Bus Pass Facility** is available to all the regular students of this University as per details below:

1. For Boys: From University to Place of Residence (Upto 60 K.M.) as per the discounted rate by the Transport Department, Haryana for 6 months.
2. For Girls: From University to Place of Residence (Upto 150 K.M.) free by the Transport Department, Haryana for 6 months.

GENERAL RULES

1. The candidates seeking admission on Haryana Open General seats are required to submit certificate of bonafide residents of Haryana as defined by the Haryana Govt. (Appendix-A) The Certificate of Haryana Resident shall be in the formats prescribed by the Govt. and issued by the competent authority (Annexure II 1-5)
2. A candidate who has passed his/her qualifying examination from a University/College situated within the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana resident and will be required to submit certificate of bonafide resident of Haryana issued by the Principal/Headmaster of the Institution last attended (Annexure II 2).
3. The candidates having passed qualifying examination from the self-styled Universities/ Institutes/Boards, declared bogus/fake by the UGC and other Govt. Bodies, shall not be eligible for admission to any program in CBLU. The list of such Universities/ Institutes/ Boards is available at (Annexure-XV). This list may vary from time to time as per notification of UGC/other Govt. bodies.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of information submitted by him/her but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that any portion of this information is incorrect or false, the student shall be removed from the University and all fees and other dues paid till the date of such removal shall be forfeited. The University may take any further action it may deem fit against the said student and his/her guardian.
5. **Attendance/Lecture Shortage:**
 - (I) No student shall be allowed to appear in the semester/year end Examination of a regular program of study unless he/she has attended not less than 75% of the lecture delivered in each of the subjects (theory as well as practical) as per amended clause of the Ordinance. Chairperson/Director of SJUC may condone 15% of attendance shortage on the production of certificate from the Dean/Director/ Coordinator, Sports/Youth Welfare/Cultural Affairs, NSS, NCC etc. regarding participation in concerned activities at University Level or production of medical certificate or any other documentary proof of distress or emergency in the family.
 - (II) Students falling short of attendance less than 50% shall not be allowed to appear in internal exams.

Student shall submit an undertaking that he/she will fulfill the minimum requirement of attendance at the time of admission (p-101) and that he/she will be responsible to complete the minimum requirement by 10 days before the commencement of examinations.

Note (i): At the end of every month, the Chairperson/Director will call the meeting of the Departmental Committee to assess attendance record of the students and accordingly the action will be as mentioned in the table given below.-

In case, a student fails to maintain attendance as per the prescribed minimum requirement, the University has introduced mandatory remedial classes to be conducted by the department under intimation to Centre for Skill Development and Remedial Education, in order to support such students academically and ensure eligibility for examinations. The student will have to pay the fee as per the following fee structure at the end of the month.

Note (ii): Remedial classes are meant to support students lagging behind academically due to various reasons including shortage of lectures.

6. Remedial Classes:

Attendance based fee Structure (per month)

Sr. No.	Attendance Range	Category	Action	Fee per month per course
I.	Less than 65%	Mild Shortage	Remedial classes	500/-
II.	Less than 55%	Moderate Shortage	Remedial classes + warning	800/-
III.	Less than 45%	Serious Shortage	Remedial classes + Undertaking from the students/parents	1200/-
IV.	Less than 35%	Very serious	Intense remedial classes + Parent meeting + case review by the authorities	1800/-

For others the remedial classes will be given at a notional fee of Rs. 50/- per course. Relaxation may be considered in genuine cases such as:

- Medical emergencies (with valid proof)
- Financial hardship (subject to approval) for the BPL students on the production of BPL certificate.
- Late Admission

Note (i): Willful attendance only after consecutive absence for every five days of teaching will be not be permitted after two instances.

Note (ii): Regular Absence: If a student is absent from the classes continuously for 6 teaching days during the academic semester/session without any intimation to the Chairperson of the Department, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the Department.

Note (iii): Readmissions: In case the name of the student struck off he/she may be allowed re-admission by Chairperson/Director within 10 days on payment of Rs. 3000/-, taking into consideration the possibility of fulfilling the requirement of attendance to be eligible to appear in the semester/year end Examination. If a student does not get re-admission, his/her admission will be deemed as cancelled. After readmission, if a student is again continuously absent for 6 days, readmission as 2nd and last instance in a semester will be allowed only after a payment of Rs. 5000/- subject to the condition above. In case of medical reasons student must send an email or request to the Chairperson along with required documents within 6 working days of proceeding on leave. Deficiency of lecture/attendance in any course will be compensated through remedial classes officially allowed.

7. Applicants should satisfy themselves about their eligibility before applying for any program.
8. No plea about the ignorance of the rules and regulations and other provisions of admission will be entertained.
9. Grant of Maternity Leave to the women students as approved by the Executive Council in its meeting held on 18.07.2017 for the various Programmes.
 - i) The women students will be entitled to avail the Maternity Leave for a period not exceeding 45 days continuously in a single stretch with the prior permission of the Head/Director of the concerned Department/Institute and the Principal of the College on production of valid Medical Certificate. The leave period may be excluded from the total lectures delivered during the

semester. But the concerned student has to appear in all the Continuous Assessment Test/Semester end Examinations etc. as per Schedule notified by the department of the University.

- ii) However, if so desired, the student may drop the full semester but she has to complete the attendance of that drop out semester after appearing in the final semester examination and shall have to appear in the drop out semester examinations according to the Even & Odd Semester policy. In such cases, she will not be required to pay the re-admission fee and the entire semester fee (if she has already paid the drop out semester fee) to complete the attendance of the drop out semester.

10. **Notwithstanding the information provided in this Handbook of Information, the Vice-Chancellor will have the right, in consultation with the Standing Committee of Academic Council, to delete, change/make additions to any of the provisions contained in it.**

If there is any dispute/ambiguity, the decision of Vice-Chancellor will prevail.

STUDENTS CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE RULES

These rules shall apply to all the students of Chaudhary Bansi Lal University, Bhiwani.

1. Acts of Indiscipline and Misconduct:

Any act of misconduct committed by a student inside or outside the campus shall be an act of violation of discipline of the University. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provision, violation of the discipline shall include:

- i) Disruption of teaching, study, examination, research or administrative work, curricular or extracurricular activity or residential life of the members of the University, including any attempt to prevent any member of the University or its staff from carrying on his or her work and doing any act reasonably likely to cause such disruption.
- ii) Damaging or defacing University property or the property of the members of the University or any other property inside or outside the University Campus.
- iii) Engaging in any attempt as wrongful confinement of teachers, officers, employees and students of the University or camping inside or creating nuisance inside the boundaries of houses of teachers, officers and other members of the University.
- iv) Use of abusive and derogatory slogans or intimidating language or incitement of hatred and violence or any act calculated to further the same.
- v) Smoking in the University Campus, Consuming or possessing alcoholic drinks, dangerous drugs or other intoxicants in the University premises.
- vi) Eve-teasing and/or disrespectful behaviour towards girl students and women.
- vii) Any assault upon or intimidation of or insulting behaviour towards a teacher, officer, employee or student or any other person in the University Campus.
- viii) Causing or assisting in any person's unauthorized entry onto the campus or their unauthorized occupation of any area of the university's property, including dorms or hostels.
- ix) Committing forgery, tampering with or misuse of University documents or records, identification cards etc.
- x) Furnishing false certificate or false information to any office under the control and jurisdiction of the University.
- xi) Indulging in acts of gambling in the University premises.
- xii) Possessing or using weapons such as knives, lathis, iron chains, iron rods, sticks, explosives and fire arms etc. in the University premises.
- xiii) Arousing communal, caste or regional feelings or creating disharmony among students.
- xiv) Not disclosing one's identity when asked to do so by an employee or officer of the University who is authorized to ask for identity.
- xv) Tearing of pages, defacing, burning or destroying books, reading materials, newspaper, journals, magazines etc. of library.
- xvi) Unauthorized use of University furniture and infrastructure in Labs, classrooms, hostels.
- xvii) Improper rendering of accounts for money drawn from or through any office under the control and of the University.
- xviii) Any offence under law
- xix) Committing any of the offences specified in the examination rules of the University (Control of unfair means and disorderly conduct).
- xx) Violation of Traffic Rules in the University premises.
- xxi) Pasting of posters, distributing of pamphlets, handbills etc. of objectionable nature or writing on walls and disfiguring buildings
- xxii) Any other act considered by the Vice-Chancellor or the Discipline Committee to be an act of violation of discipline.
- xxiii) Posting the content on social media (for example, Twitter, Facebook, Google+, LinkedIn, Instagram, WhatsApp, open forums and Blogs) maligning the University and /or its policies and employees.
- xxiv) Any adverse content on social media that goes against the rules of the University and /or the constitution of India.
- xxv) Speaking on behalf of, or represent, the University on social media websites without the

University's prior permission.

xxvi) Any form of harassment, including on social media platform.

xxvii) Posting others' content online like photographs, text, videos, music etc. without prior and proper permission.

2. Disciplinary Action

The following Officers are authorized to take disciplinary action by way of imposing penalties:

i) Proctor

ii) Deans of the Faculties/Dean, Students Welfare

iii) Chairpersons/Heads of the Departments

iv) Chief Warden(Boys/Girls)

v) Principals / Directors of the Colleges/Institutions

vi) Any other person employed by the University and authorized by the Vice-Chancellor for the purpose provided that the penalties on the offences relating to Examinations will be dealt with by the relevant bodies.

3. Penalties

Any or any combination of the following penalties can be imposed upon any student of the University found involved in the acts of indiscipline:

i) Written warning and information to the guardian.

ii) Fine as may be warranted by the nature of case.

iii) Placement on Conduct Probation.

iv) Temporary or permanent withdrawal of concessions/aids/stipends/ scholarships /fellowships/ any other facility etc.

v) Removal/debarring part time/full time from the Department/University.

vi) Permanent or temporary expulsion from hostel.

vii) Recovery of pecuniary loss caused to University property.

viii) Debarring from participation in Sports/NCC/NSS and other such activities.

ix) Disqualifying from holding any representative position in the Class/College/ Hostel/Mess/Sports/Clubs and in similar other bodies.

x) Permanent or temporary expulsion from the Department/ Hostel/ Mess/ Library/ Clubs for a specified period.

xi) Debarring from an examination.

xii) Imposing a security deposit which might be confiscated at the discretion in the event of student being found guilty of indiscipline, which will include misdemeanor.

xiii) Non-issuance of Migration Certificate.

xiv) Expulsion from the University for a specified period.

xv) Rustication from the University.

xvi) Forfeiture of right to admission to any course in the University in future/forfeiture of right to employment in the University in future.

xvii) Any student against whom an allegation of misconduct has been made may be suspended from the rolls of the University by the Vice-Chancellor, pending enquiry or pending trial on a recognizable offence by a court of Law.

4. Opportunity to be given before Award of Penalty

No penalty shall be imposed without giving to the student an opportunity of being heard.

5. Review of Appeal against the Penalty

A review would lie to the Officer issuing the orders within 7 days, and an appeal would lie against the orders of the authorities mentioned in these rules (except the Vice-Chancellor) with the Vice-Chancellor within 15 days. The Proctorial Board of the University may also review its decision on its own.

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instructions No. 62/17/95-6GS-I, dated 03.10.1996 and No. 62/03/2021-6GS-I, dated 14.01.2021 on the subject cited above and to say that Government has decided to further revise para 1(v) of the instructions as under :-

1(v) (A) For the purpose of Employment of Haryana Residents under the Haryana State Employment of Local Candidates, Act 2020 and for the purpose of Grant of Employment Generation Subsidy to industrial units under the Haryana Employment and Entrepreneurship Policy, 2020 or other sector specific industrial policies - Children/dependents/wards (if parents are not living) of persons who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Five (5) years; or who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Five (5) years but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana; or who do not have permanent residence in Haryana but have been residing in Haryana for a period not less than Five (5) years.

✓ (B) For the purpose of admissions, scholarships, unemployment allowance and weightage under Socio-economic Criteria - Children/dependents/wards (if parents are not living) of persons who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Fifteen (15) years; or who have permanent home in Haryana since a period not less than Fifteen (15) years but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana; or who do not have permanent residence in Haryana but have been residing in Haryana for a period not less than Fifteen (15) years.

2. These instructions will be applicable with immediate effect and may please be brought to the notice of all concerned.

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October, 1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011- 6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

Subject: Bonafide residents of Haryana - Guidelines regarding.

1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/ medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate: -
 - (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana.
 - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents: -
 - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation;
 - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government;
 - (iii) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - (v) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (vii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above- mentioned categories are:
 - (a) Citizen of India;
 - (b) Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/ dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - (viii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.
2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub- Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-Divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere or in respect of the Children/ Wards/Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the Children/ Wards/Department of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of the employees and retirees of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/ Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/ Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/technical/ medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.



Subject - Supreme Court order dated July 08, 2020 in Civil Appeal No. 2718/2020 (Arising out of SLP (C) No. 21429 of 2019) in the matter titled as Aryan Raj Vs. Chandigarh Administration and others.

Please refer to letter No. 22920-12/Clerk-4 DW SJE 2020 dated 17.11.2020 and subsequent reminder dated 03.02.2021 and 03.09.2021 on subject cited above.

The above mentioned Civil Appeal No. 2718/2020 (Arising out of SLP (C) No. 21429 of 2019) titled as Aryan Raj Vs. Chandigarh Administration and others Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in its order dated July 08, 2020 observed that Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates are required to obtained 35% passing marks to pass in the aptitude test as against the requirement of 40% for general

candidates. The relaxed criteria of 35% pass marks in aptitude test shall apply to the candidates with disabilities also for admission.

The Hon'ble Supreme Court Directed all States/UTs to take up the matter with Department of Education, Culture, General Administration and other concerned department on the following aspects:-

- a. Adopt a uniform qualifying criteria for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities included the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes categories for admission to various higher educational courses.
- b. Issue appropriate advisory to all Universities to develop courses suitable for Persons with Intellectual developmental, mental disabilities for their educational empowerment.
- c. Consider increasing such number of seats in the discipline of painting and applied art.

Therefore, it is requested to send information regarding policies followed by your Department/University on above said matter.

No. Leg.15/2020.—The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 25th March, 2020 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 14 OF 2020

THE HARYANA SCHEDULED CASTES (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION IN GOVERNMENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2020

AN

ACT

to provide for reservation in admission in Government educational institutions to persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes in the State of Haryana with special measures for deprived Scheduled Castes and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Seventy-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. This Act may be called the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institutions) Act, 2020. Short title.
2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,- Definitions.
 - (a) "Annexure" means the Annexure appended to this Act;
 - (b) "competent authority" means an officer appointed under section 5;
 - (c) "deprived Scheduled Castes" means such Scheduled Castes as specified in Annexure;
 - (d) "Government educational institution" means any higher education institution established and maintained by the Government or receiving aid out of the State funds, imparting education leading to the award of a degree including a post-graduate degree and shall include Government aided technical and professional institutions;
 - (e) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana in the administrative department;
 - (f) "prescribed" means prescribed by the rules;
 - (g) "Scheduled Castes" means Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India.
3.
 - (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions. Reservation.
 - (2) Fifty per cent of the twenty per cent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Annexure.
4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes. Seats not to be carried forward to next year.

Competent authority to issue certificate.	<p>5. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer as competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.</p> <p>(2) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of section 3, issue caste identification certificate specifying the caste name of the Scheduled Caste, in such manner, as may be prescribed.</p> <p>(3) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.</p> <p>(4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860).</p>
Certificate of identification.	<p>6. A person belonging to the deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.</p>
Protection of action taken in good faith.	<p>7. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rule or order made thereunder.</p>
Power to remove difficulties.	<p>8. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.</p>
Power to make rules.	<p>9. (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.</p> <p>(2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.</p>
Review of Annexure.	<p>10. The Government may, on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed and on the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of five years thereafter, review the Scheduled Castes included in the Annexure.</p>

Subject : **Classification of Scheduled Castes for the purpose of benefit of reservation in Haryana State.**

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Government instructions issued vide No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 and thereafter regarding rate(s) of reservation in Govt. jobs and to say that in compliance of the judgement dated 01.08.2024 of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case titled "State of Punjab v/s Davinder Singh (CA No. 2317 of 2011) with regard to sub-classification and adequacy of representation, the matter was referred to the Haryana State Commission for Scheduled Castes for examination and to send their recommendations to address intra-community disparities and to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of reservation benefits. The Commission submitted their report on 16th August, 2024 prepared on the basis of analysis of the data received from various sources including different Departments and of the demands, representations and review of literature related to the subject. The recommendations of the Commission regarding classification of Scheduled Castes reservation in Govt. jobs were considered by the State Government. After the approval of Council of Ministers, it has been decided that—

- (i) For the purpose of reservation in services, the Scheduled Castes in Haryana will be sub-categorized in two categories i.e. Deprived Scheduled Castes (DSC) and Other Scheduled Castes (OSC).
- (ii) List of Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes has been enclosed at **Annexure-A** of these instructions.
- (iii) Within the existing 20% quota reserved for Scheduled Castes in direct recruitment to Govt. jobs, one-half of the posts will be reserved for candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (iv) Similarly, one-half of the quota reserved for Scheduled Castes shall be reserved for candidates belonging to Other Scheduled Castes. If and only if suitable candidates of Other Scheduled Castes are not available, then suitable candidates of Deprived Scheduled Castes may be recruited against the balance vacant posts.
- (v) The combined merit list of the candidates belonging to Deprived Scheduled Castes and Other Scheduled Castes selected/recommended by the Recruiting Agency will

be prepared and inter-se seniority of such candidates will also be fixed on the basis of merit.

- (vi) It will not be necessary to fix the roster points separately for each of the sub-categories within the present roster system.
 - (vii) If on a particular occasion the total number of vacant posts (cadre wise) meant for Scheduled Castes is odd, say 9, then 5 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 4 posts to Other Scheduled Castes. On the next such occasion, however, the position would be reversed, i.e. 4 of them will go to Deprived Scheduled Castes and 5 posts to Other Scheduled Castes.
 - (viii) After the issue of these instructions, the first vacant post reserved for Scheduled Castes will be allocated to Deprived Scheduled Castes without any change in the roster point already maintained by the Department.
2. These instructions will be applicable with immediate effect and Annexure-B of instructions bearing No. 22/10/2013-1GS-III, dated 15.07.2014 in which the list of castes which are to be treated as Scheduled Castes in Haryana State has been specified for the purpose of reservation in jobs under Government/Government Undertakings and Local Bodies as well as for admission in Government/Government aided educational/technical professional institutions, will be deemed to have been replaced with the Annexure-A of these instructions.
3. These instructions may please be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Government Notification bearing No. Leg.15/2020, dated 15.05.2020 vide which an Act namely, the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in Admission in Government Educational Institution) Act, 2020 was enacted by the State Government. In this Act under Section 3 and 6 following provisions have been made:-

Section 3. (1) Twenty per cent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.


(2) Fifty per cent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Caste as enumerated in the Annexure.

Section 6. A person belonging to the Deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.

2. In this Act, 36 Castes were included in the list of Deprived Scheduled Castes at Annexure to this Act. For proper implementation of this Act, all the authorities competent to issue Caste Certificate are directed to mention clearly that the Certificate is of 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' or 'Scheduled Caste' so that at the time of admission the Institutions may find out easily as to how many candidates applied

for admission and how many have been given admission under 'Deprived Scheduled Caste' category.

3. These instructions may please be brought to the notice of all concerned for strict compliance.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over- inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-5-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.5.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/ sections mentioned in Annexure 'A', which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

The Backward Classes of Haryana are facing difficulty in obtaining the Backward Classes certificate from the certificate issuing authority due to some understanding in the instructions dated 7.6.95. After careful consideration the Govt. of Haryana has decided to issue clear cut directions to all the Heads of Departments and Deputy Commissioners in the state for issuing Backward Classes Certificate without any further delay.

It is clarified that the income from salary will not be taken into account for the purpose of income/wealth tax in respect of service category and while calculating income or wealth tax of the Government employee of Backward Classes who is not covered under Annexure-A, description of categories No. I, II (a,b,c,d) and III & IV, hence becoming entitled for the benefit of reservation under Backward Classes category, his salary should not be included but his other sources of income/wealth be included for income/wealth tax. All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Head of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

No. Leg.18/2016.— The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 1st April, 2016 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 15 OF 2016.**THE HARYANA BACKWARD CLASSES (RESERVATION IN SERVICES AND ADMISSION IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2016.**

AN

ACT

To provide for reservation in services and admission in educational institutions to persons belonging to Backward Classes in the State of Haryana and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

WHEREAS clause (4) of article 15 of the Constitution of India enables the State to make special provision for the advancement of any socially and educationally Backward Classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes;

AND WHEREAS clause (5) of article 15 of the Constitution of India enables the State to make special provisions, by law, for the advancement of any socially and educationally Backward Classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes or Scheduled Tribes in so far as such special provisions relate to their admission to educational institutions including private aided educational institutions whether aided or unaided by the State, other than minority educational institutions referred to in clause (1) of article 30 of the Constitution;

AND WHEREAS clause (4) of article 16 of the Constitution enables the State to make any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any Backward Classes of citizens which, in the opinion of the State, is not adequately represented in the services under the State;

AND WHEREAS clause (1) of article 38 of the Constitution provides that State shall strive to promote the welfare of the people by securing and protecting as effectively as it may a social order in which justice, social, economic and political, shall inform all the institutions of the national life;

AND WHEREAS clause (2) of article 38 of the Constitution provides that the State shall in particular strive to minimize the inequality in income, and endeavour to eliminate inequalities in status, facilities and opportunities, not only amongst individuals but also amongst groups of people residing in different areas or engaged in different vocations;

AND WHEREAS under article 46 of the Constitution, the State shall promote with special care, the educational and economic interest of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitations;

AND WHEREAS the State of Haryana has decided to provide for reservation of seats in educational institutions including private educational institutions aided by the State;

AND WHEREAS the State of Haryana is of the opinion that the Backward Classes of citizens in the State are not adequately represented in the services under the State and therefore, it has been decided to provide for reservation of seats in appointments in the services under the State to Backward Classes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Sixty-seventh Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

- Short title. **1.** This Act may be called the Haryana Backward Classes (Reservation in Services and Admissions in Educational Institutions) Act, 2016.
- Definitions. **2.** In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
- (a) "appointment" means an appointment by direct recruitment;
 - (b) "Backward Classes" means such classes of citizens as specified in Schedule I, II or III;
 - (c) "competent authority" means an officer or an authority authorised to make admission into educational institutions or appointment in services under the State or an authority empowered by the State under sections 8 and 9, as the case may be;
 - (d) "creamy layer" means such class of persons within the Backward Classes as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette specify for the purposes of this Act;
 - (e) "educational institutions" means any institution imparting education, established and maintained by the Government, or receiving aid out of the State funds, and includes Government/Government Aided Technical and Professional Institutions;
 - (f) "Government" means the Government of the State of Haryana;
 - (g) "prescribed" means prescribed by the rules made under this Act;
 - (h) "Schedule" means the Schedules appended to this Act; and
 - (i) "services" means and includes the services under the Government, the Legislature of the State, any institution of Self Government, any local authority, any corporation or company owned or controlled by the State or any such other authority.
- Reservation in services. **3.** While making appointment, reservation shall be made for the members of the Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- Reservation in educational institutions. **4.** While making admissions in educational institutions, reservation shall be made for the members of the Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- Restrictions with regards to creamy layer. **5.** (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, no person belonging to the creamy layer of Backward Classes shall be—
- (a) considered for admission in educational institutions against the seats reserved therein for Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule; or
 - (b) entitled to claim reservation in or be considered for appointment in services under the State against the posts reserved for Backward Classes as specified in the Schedule.
- (2) The Government shall, by notification, after taking into consideration social, economic and such other factors, as deemed appropriate, specify the criteria for exclusion and identification of persons belonging to the Backward Classes as creamy layer.
- (3) The criteria fixed under sub-section (2) shall be reviewed every three years.
- Horizontal reservation. **6.** Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the State Government may provide for horizontal reservation for such category or categories of persons within Backward Classes, as it may deem necessary from time to time.
- Seats for admission not to be carried forward to next year. **7.** Where the seats reserved for Backward Classes for admission in educational institutions are not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidates possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall, after the display of the final list of such admissions for that year, be made available to candidates of general categories by the educational institution.
- Competent authority to issue certificate. **8.** (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer to be the competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
- (2) The competent authority may, for the purposes of sections 3 and 4, issue caste identification certificate in terms of Schedule in such manner, as may be prescribed.
- (3) The competent authority shall exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
- (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (45 of 1860).

- 9.** A person belonging to the Backward Class as specified in the Schedule shall, for the purposes of sections 3 and 4, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority. Certificate of identification by competent authority.
- 10.** No suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act, or any rule or order made thereunder. Protection of action taken in good faith.
- 11.** If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the State Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty: Power to remove difficulties.
 Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.
- 12.** (1) The Government shall, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act. Power to make rules.
 (2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made or issued, be laid before the State Legislature.
- 13.** The Government shall at the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of ten years thereafter, undertake revision of the Schedule. Review of Schedule.
- 14.** The provisions of this Act shall have effect, notwithstanding anything inconsistent therewith contained in any other State law for the time being in force or any instrument having effect by virtue of any such law. Overriding effect.
- 15.** Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, the reservation made, and anything done or any action taken on the basis of such reservation, by the Government for admission to educational institutions and for appointment in the services for the Backward Classes on the date of coming into force of this Act, shall, for all purposes be deemed to be and to have always been, validly made, done or taken in accordance with law, as if this Act had been in force at all material times when such reservation has been made and such thing done or action taken. Validation.

Subject: **Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.**

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government Instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under:-



Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

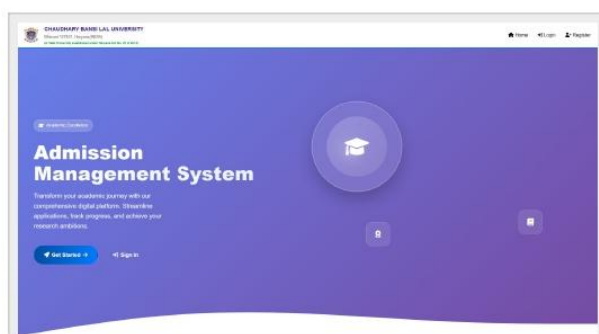

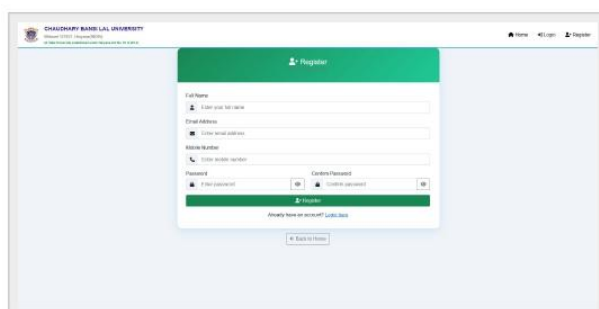

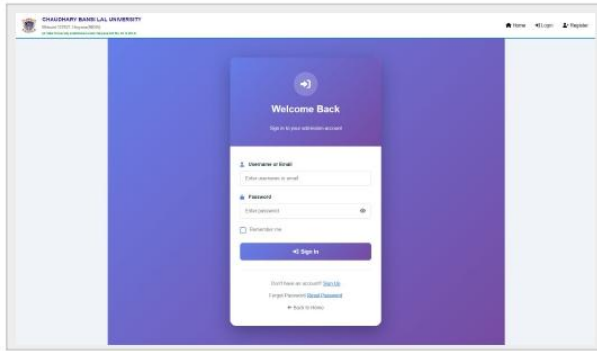

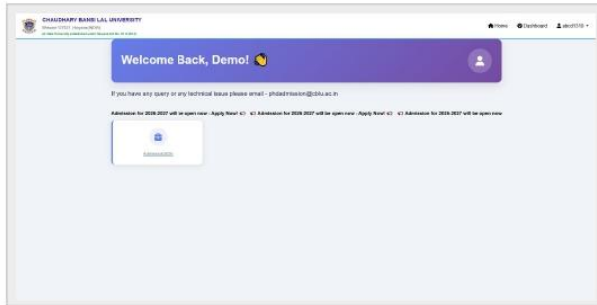
